Results from a Public Opinion Survey

Survey Methodology

This online survey was conducted by Zogby Analytics on behalf of Research!America in August 2020, among 1,025 adults plus 869 additional adults for minority oversampling. The survey was supported in part by the Kavli Foundation as a component of support for a working group formed to address America's commitment to science. For the national sample, the survey has a theoretical sampling error of +/- 3.1 percentage points.* Sample sizes for minority groups are as follows:

- African American: sample size = 404, margin of error +/- 4.9 percentage points
- Hispanic: sample size = 409, margin of error = +/- 4.8 percentage points
- Asian: sample size 403, margin of error = 4.9 percentage points

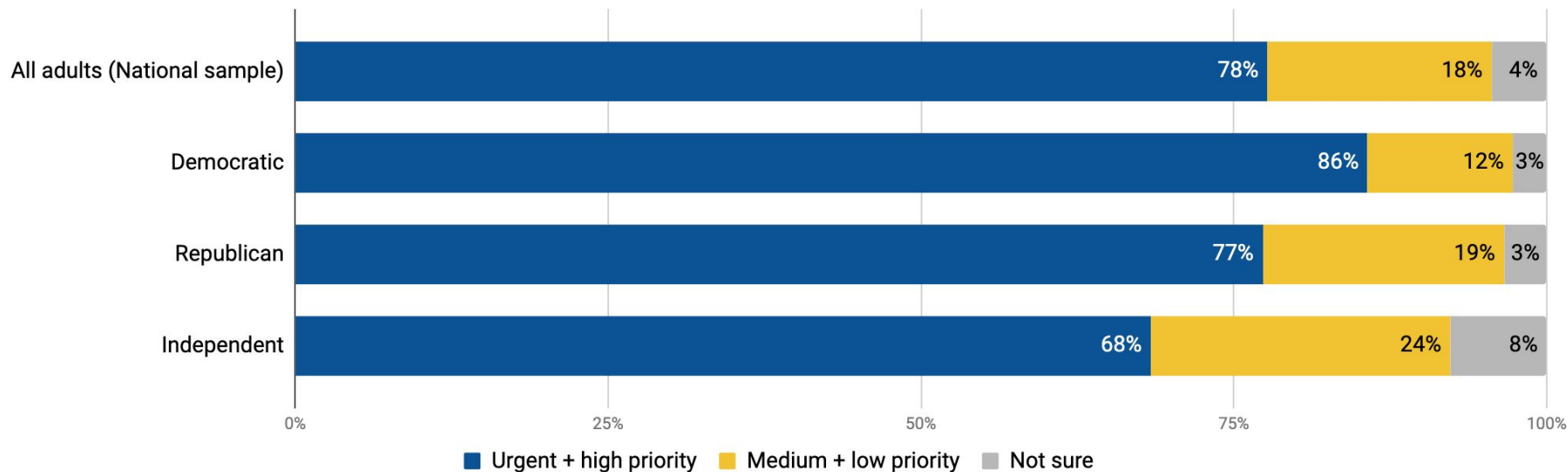

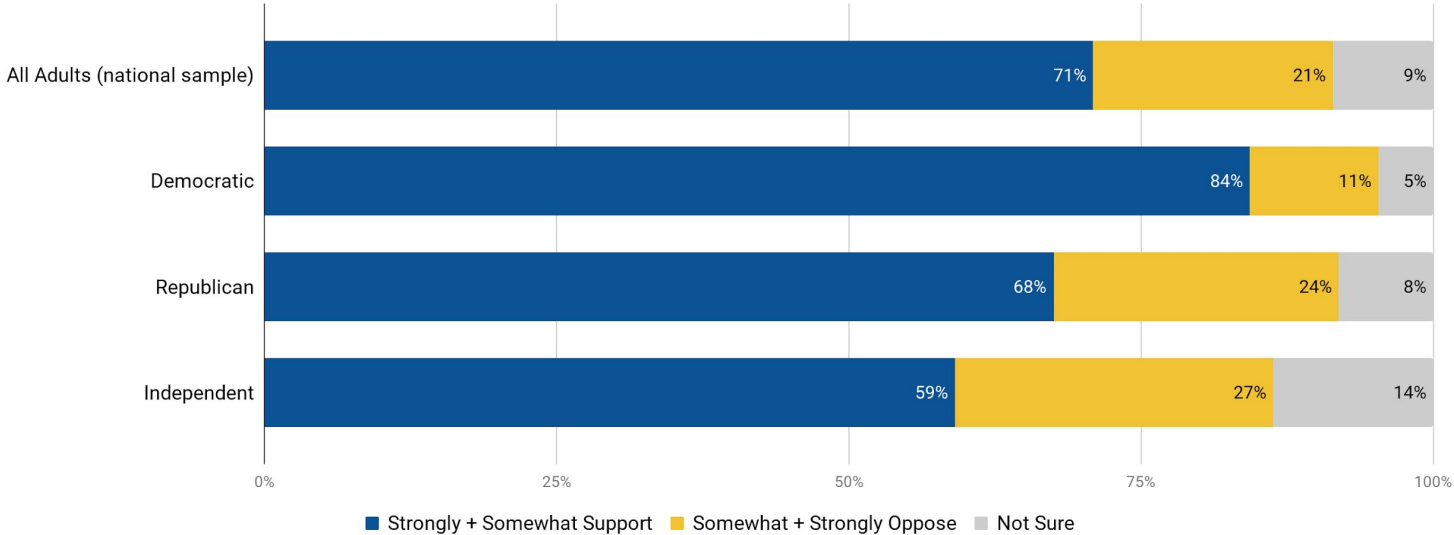
Strong Majority of Americans Place an Urgent or High Priority on Improving the Public Health System

Majorities Across Parties Would Pay More In Taxes to Support Emergency Public Health Fund

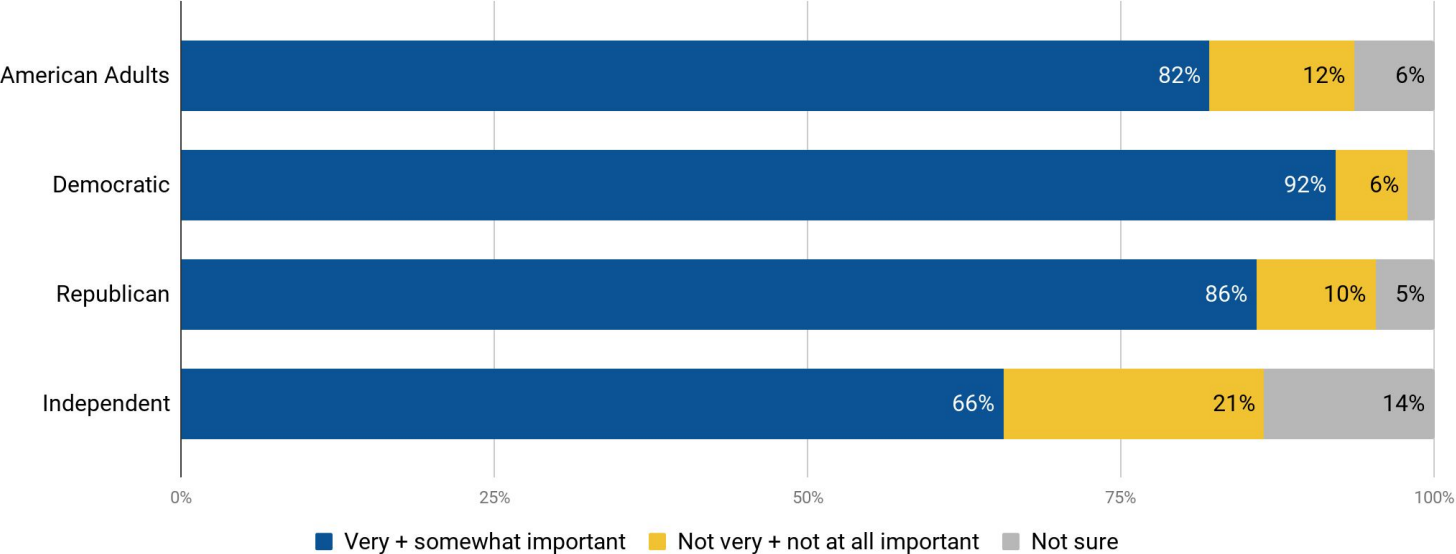
Would you support or oppose paying \$1 per week more in taxes to support an emergency public health fund to address health threats like a pandemic?

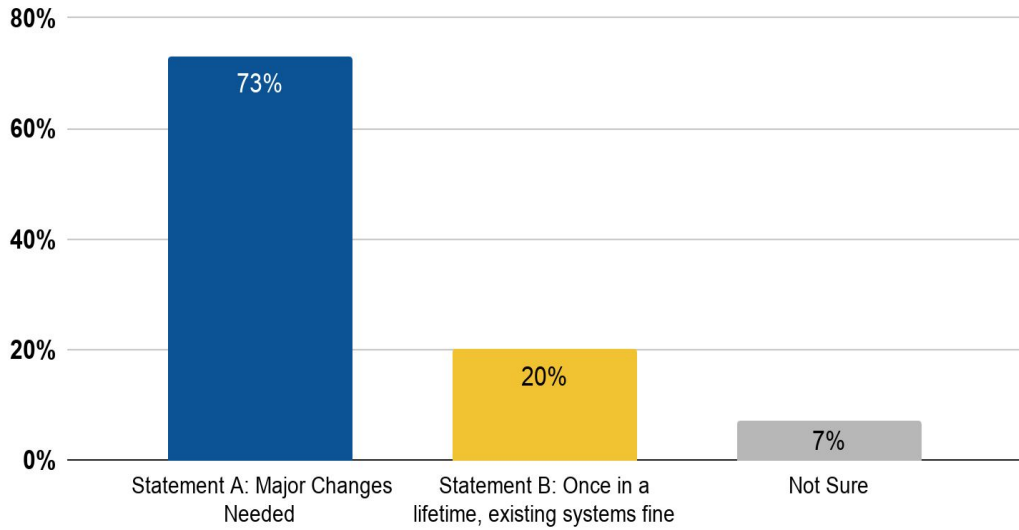

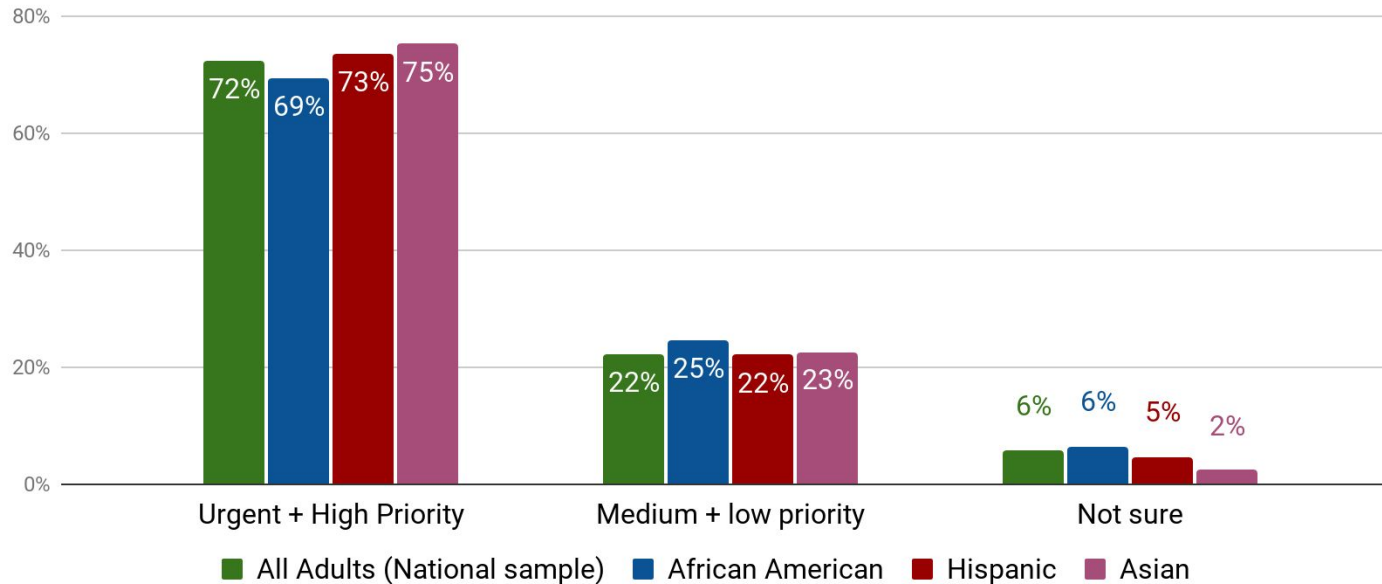


Hispanic (81%) and Asian (81%) respondents more likely to agree with Statement A.

Young people ages 18-29 less likely to agree with Statement A (64%)

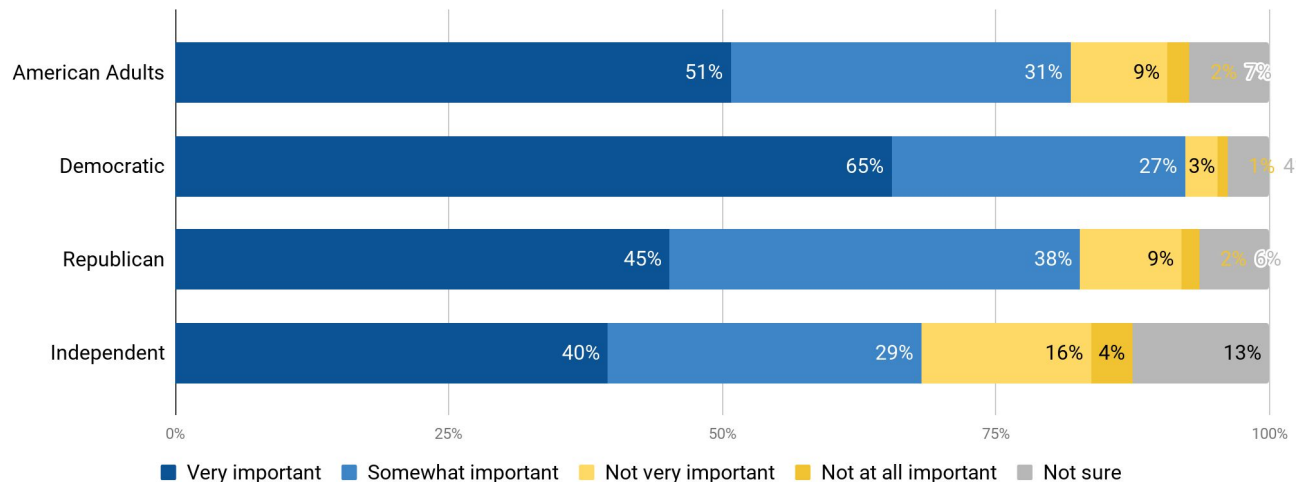
Eliminating Health Disparities a High Priority for Americans

Strong Support for Research on Health Disparities

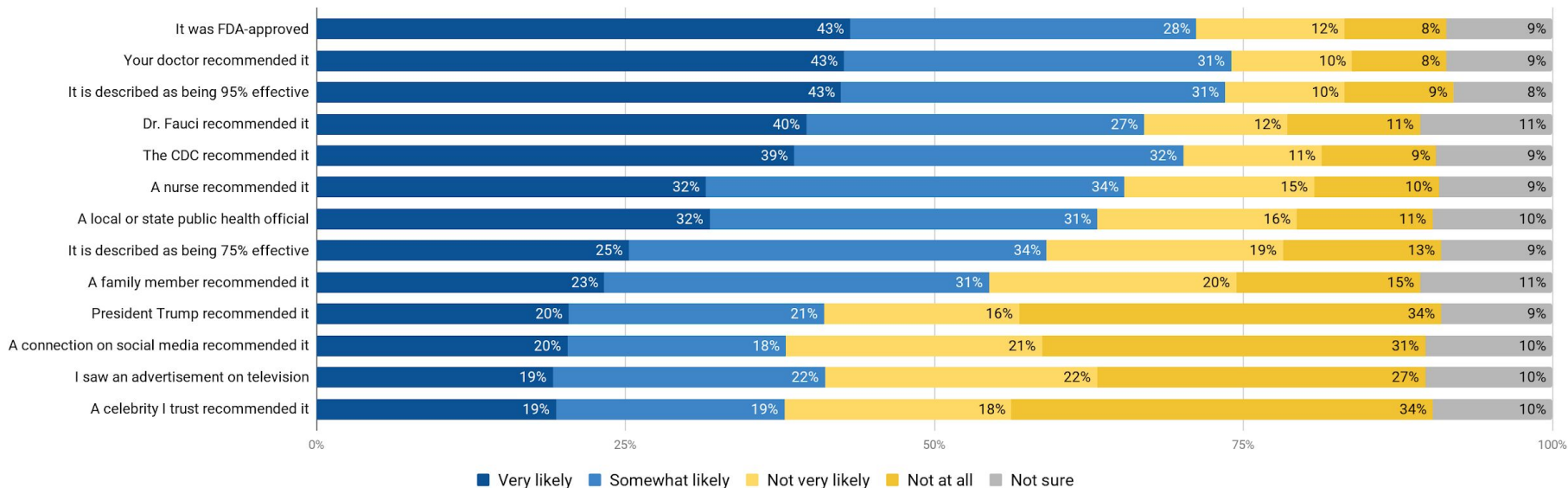

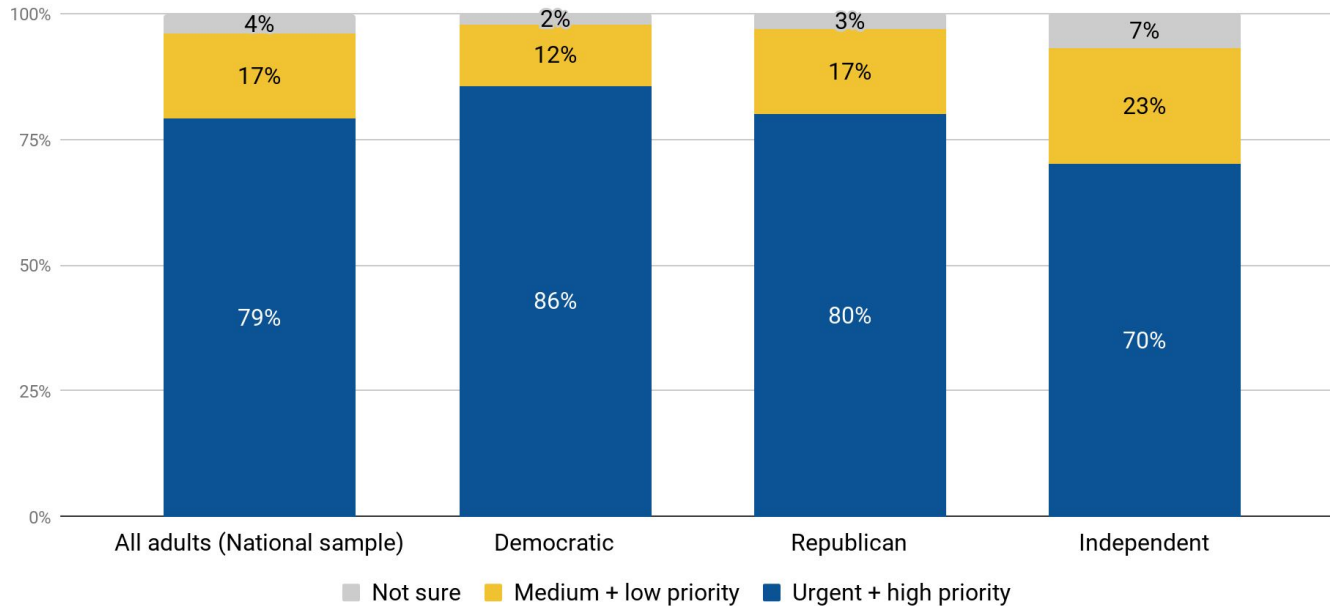
Majority More Likely to Get COVID-19 Vaccine if FDA-Approved or Recommended by Doctor

Suppose you heard a vaccine was available that protected you from COVID-19. Please indicate how likely you would be to get the vaccine based on the following factors:



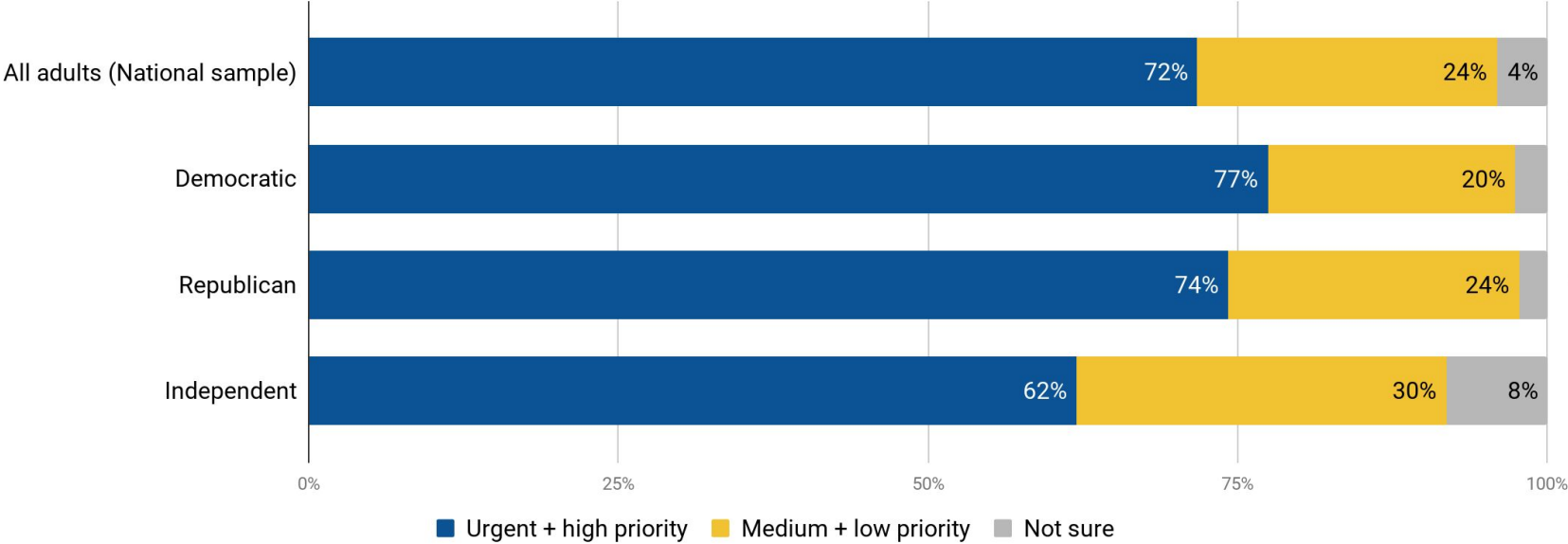
Safe Drinking Water a High Priority for Majority of Americans

How much of a priority are each of the following issues for the United States - Assuring a safe drinking water supply



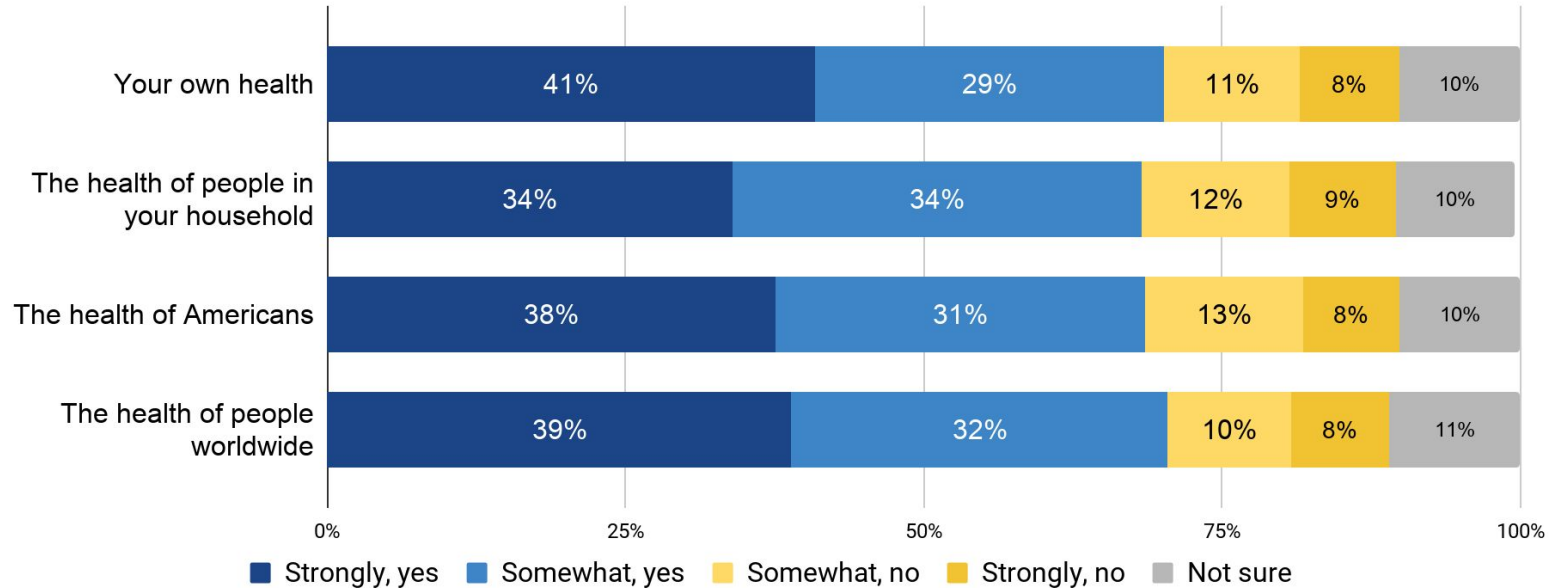
Addressing Drug and Opioid Abuse a High Priority Across Parties

How much of a priority are each of the following issues for the United States - Addressing drug and other opioid abuse



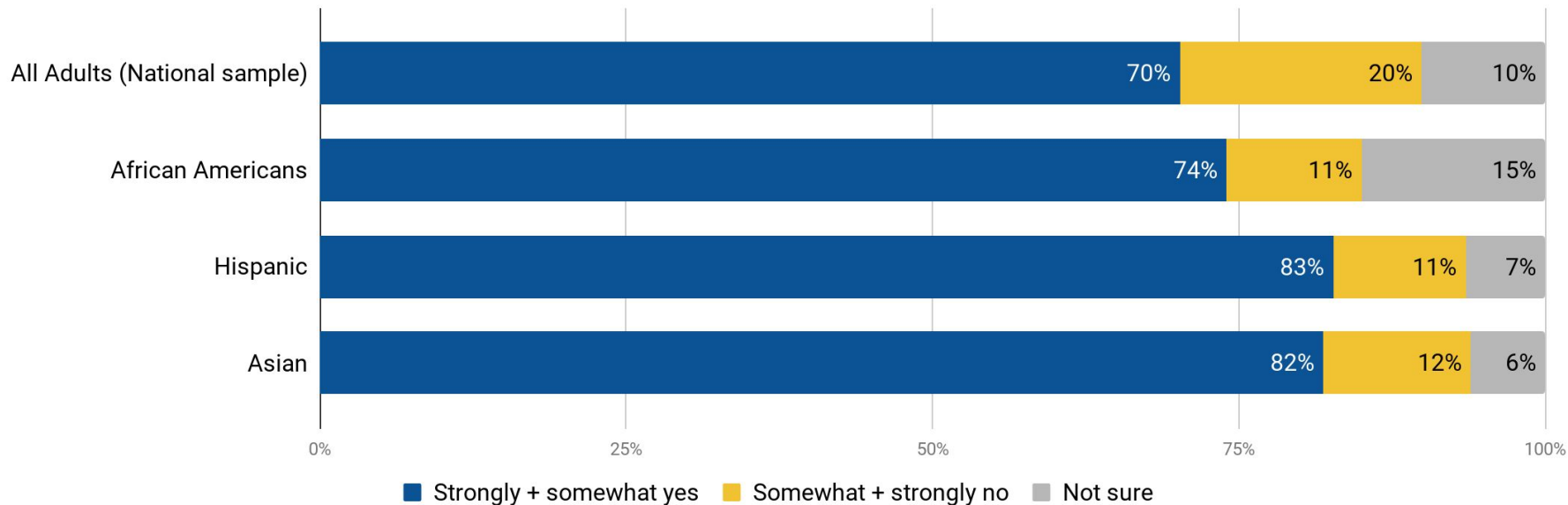
Americans Concerned About Future Climate Impact on Health
